Dates and times:

Our parent teacher consultations cycles begin next week. If your child has had a Focus Observation this week or last week, you will receive it back and book in a telephone conversation to discuss next steps for your child which you can do at home and which we will support your child with at school. The 10 minute time slots for these phone calls will be after school on Thursday and Friday and we will book you in at the start of the week.

As you know, we start the session with register. During this time which children are free to enjoy the garden and play in the fresh air. We then get our four colour

This is a super time to talk and connect with their key person and friends. The story and discussion usually inspire more involved child-led experiences, which are supported by teachers. This is when we follow and develop children's own exploration and interests.

matching, shaking and counting. We also threaded the buttons and practised cutting.

Colour mixing took root after reading "Mouse Paint" by Ellen Stoll Walsh.



The children had a wonderful time creating their colour pictures. Look out for the display next week.


Our Falling Apples poem was only begun on Friday and we introduced it with an apple tree branch and a basket
