up the post as head teacher going forwards. We also feel fortunate and are delighted to be welcoming back Zoe Wakefield as Nursery School teacher.



"Children cannot control their body temperature as efficiently as adults during hot weather because they not sweat as much and so can be at risk of ill-health from heat." We will remain open and follow the guidelines to protect your children from ill health from heat.

If you choose to keep your children at home during this coming heat wave on Monday and Tuesday, we will respect and support your parental choice.

We have consulted "government guidance for looking after children and those in early years settings under heatwaves" and will be working from the following principles during sessions of those two days:

- We will be monitoring health risks from heat: looking for signs of heat stress and heat exhaustion and heat stroke.
- We ask you to dress your children in loose long-sleeved tops, large-brimmed hats and apply sun cream to avoid burning.
- We will be encouraging children to drink cool water regularly throughout the day.
- We will be keeping children out of the sun and either in the shade or indoors, engaged in low energy activities and experiences so as not to get to hot from vigorous activity.



• We will keep electrical lighting to a minimum
