Communication and Language Development

### Stage 1

Shows an interest in stories & rhyme

Babbles and is beginning to using single words/

Listens and responds to simple/basic instructions

### Stage 2

Listens to simple stories and engages with the pictures

Understands a wider range of words and is beginning to use short sentences, jumping from one topic to another

Understands is and beginning to use who, what, where and why

### Stage 3

Enjoys longer stories and is able to remember and retell a story

Initiates a conversation through verbal/ nonverbal communication

# To be a physically active adventurer Physical development



### Stage 1

Gradually gaining control of their whole body through continual practice in large movements

Trying a wider range of foods with different tastes and textures

Reaching out for objects and toys as coordination develops

### Stage 2

Can walk, run, jump and climb, and is starting to use stairs independently

Shows an increasing desire to be independent, such as wanting to feed and dress themselves

Developing manipulation and controls by exploring different materials and tools

### Stage 3

Balances on equipment with support

Can follow a sequence of actions when getting dressed and undressed with support

Experiments with handling and using tools with guidance

## Self-Reliant Individual

We promote personal, social and emotional development by building strong relationships with children through key person system, turn taking during play and encouraging friendships between children. Using emotion coaching to teach children about their emotions.



To be a...

Physically Active Adventurer We provide continuous provision throughout the year that helps children build on physical development such as daily outdoor play, playdough, mark making, malleable play, music and movement. We enhance the environment with different resources that builds on both fine and gross motor. We promote children's independence through self-care during routine, e.g. handwashing, mealtimes, dressing etc.
